UNIQUE TRAITS OF A CLUB

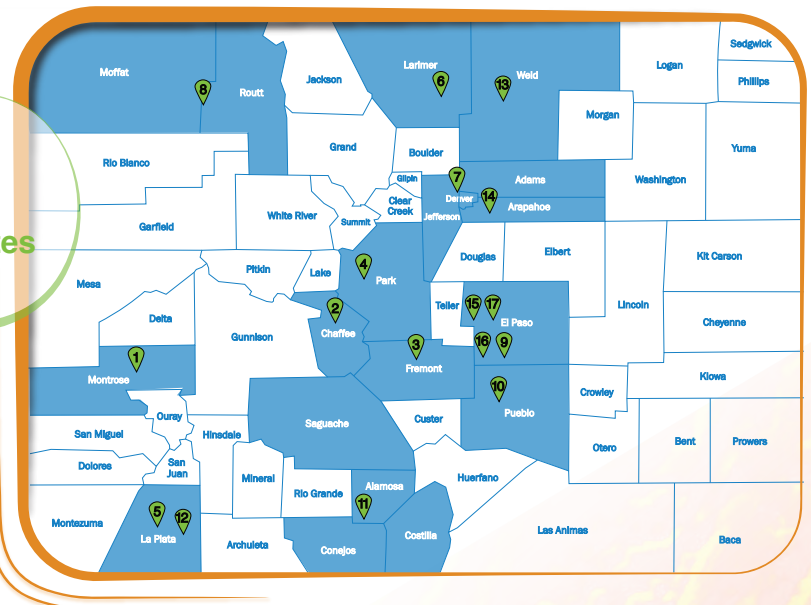
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- Clubs are located in safe, dedicated youth facilities.

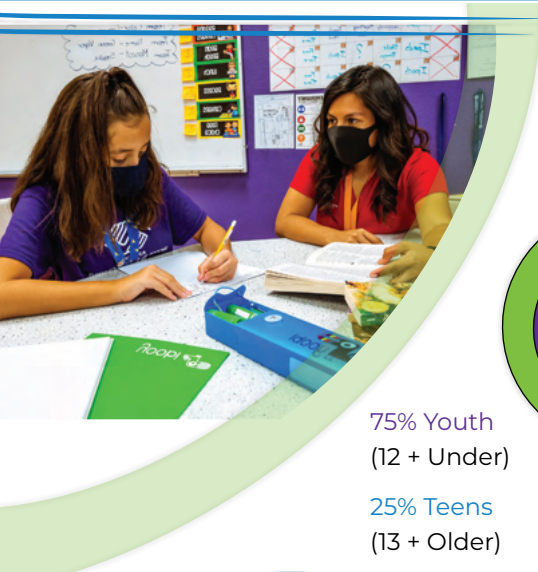

WHO WE SERVE

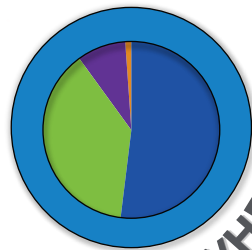

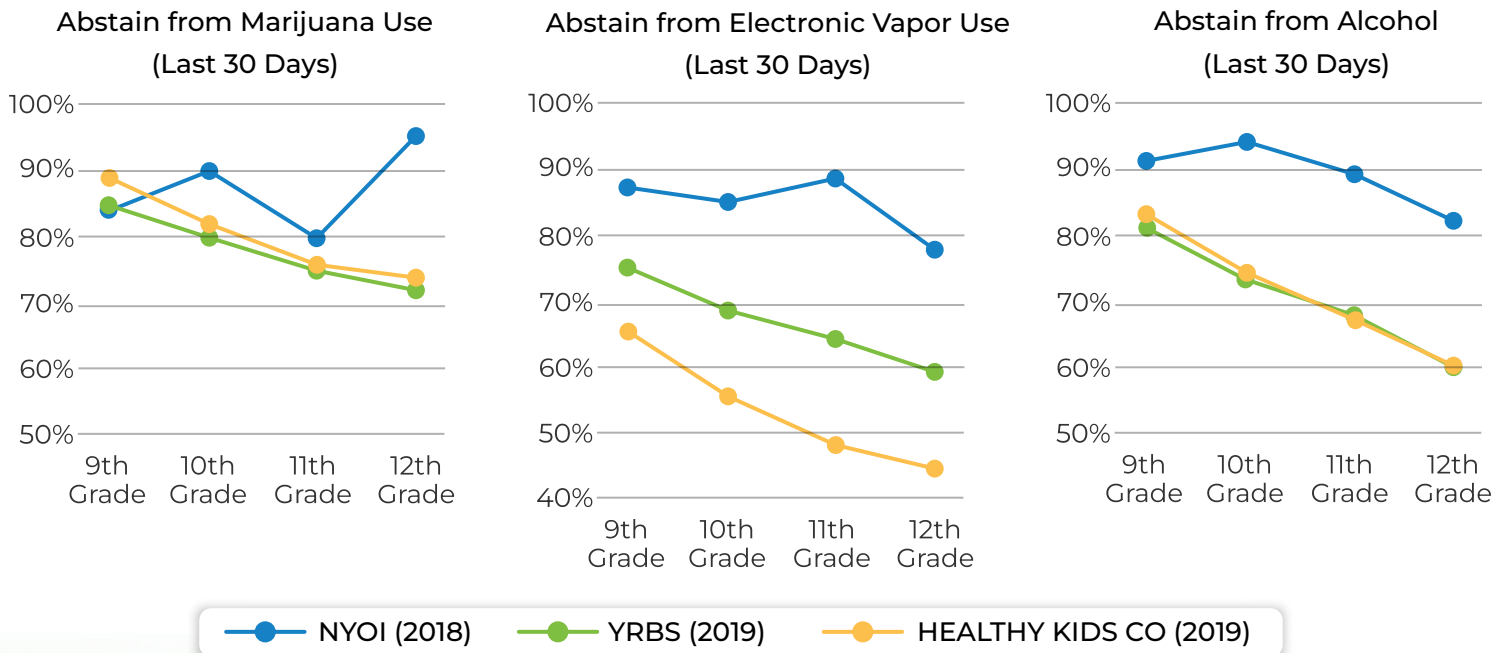


IMPACT REPORT

Each year, Clubs collect data about key program areas from youth using the National Youth Outcomes Initiative (NYOI) survey. This ensures that Clubs' outcome-driven programming is driving transformational change for youth and their communities.
