We support Colorado Boys & Girls Clubs to enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, and responsible citizens

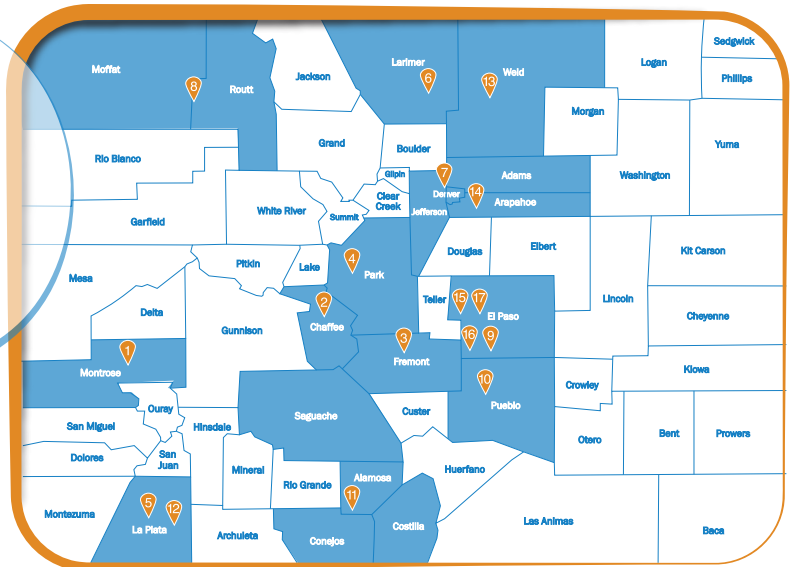
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UNIQUE TRAITS OF A CLUB

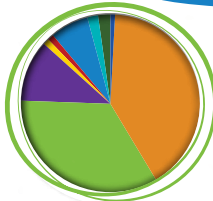

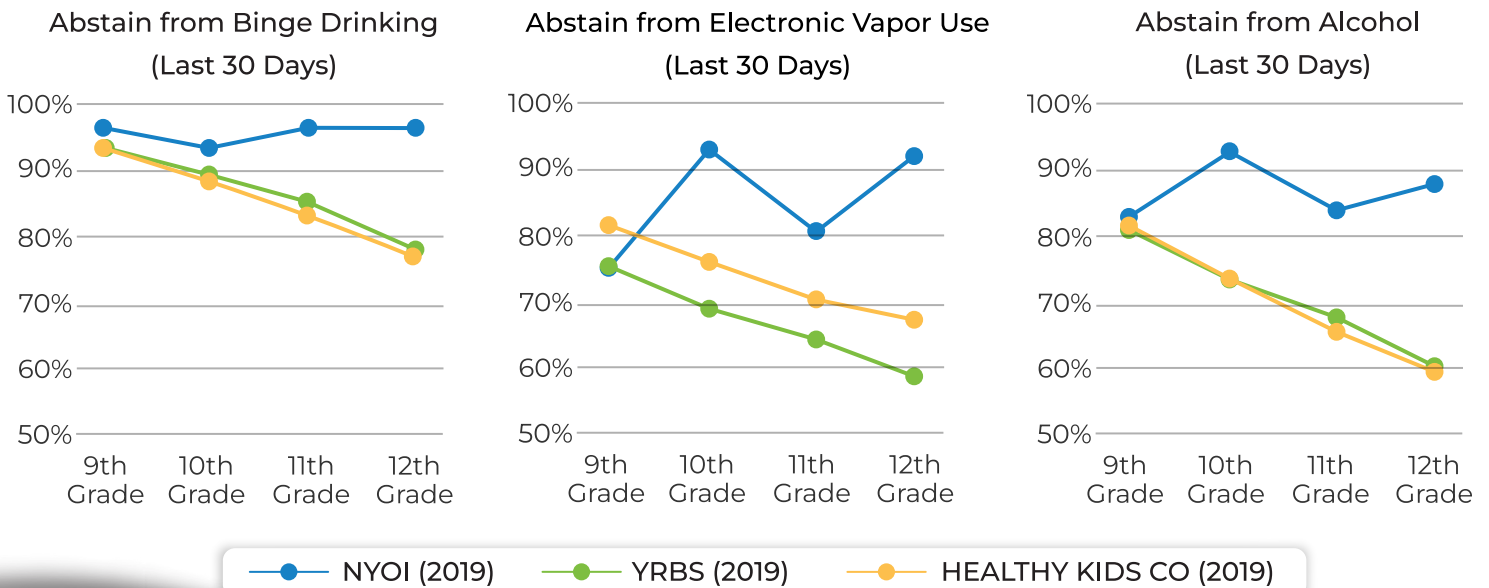
IMPACT REPORT

COLORADO CLUB KIDS ARE MORE LIKELY TO...

Each year, Clubs collect data about key program areas from youth using the National Youth Outcomes Initiative survey. This ensures that Clubs' outcome-driven programming is driving transformational change for youth and their communities.

96% of club youth (5th - 12th) are on grade level.



86% of club teens expect to complete a post secondary education. (including junior college + trade school)



90% of club youth have an adult to go to for help with a serious problem.



81% of youth believe they can make a difference in their community.

77% of teens volunteered at least once in their community.
